

MARY MARTIN HOSPITAL, BENIN CITY, NIGERIA
The Mary Martin Hospital is situated at Benin City, Nigeria, West Africa. The facility is administered by the Medical Missionaries of Mary Sisters. Evolving needs assessed led to the establishment of the Facility to attend to the unmet health needs in the locality. It was set up as a homebased and mobile outreach clinic working in 5 Local Government Areas, providing preventative, curative & rehabilitative care, elderly care, palliative care, maternal and child health, health education and awareness raising through sensitization. It has a strong collaboration with MOH, local government, community leaders and education boards. The Hospital has a geographical link with Teaching Hospital and University of Benin. As such, 40% of the local population is made up from these 2 institutions (students, academics, medical and paramedical staff). The remaining 60% of people are socioeconomically vulnerable, they lack affordable access to health services; of these 10% are children under 5 yrs, 12% are young people vulnerable to rape and abuse, 22% are women of childbearing age.
